SUNFLOWERS FOR MOM



MATERIALS

- DB37467 Scurve Dinner Plate OR any plate or mug with a flat surface
- Pencil with New Eraser
- #1 Short Liner Brush
- #2 Round Brush
- #6 Round Brush
- CMM19 – Banana Boat
- CMM13 – Cinnamon Stick
- CMM18 – Pumpkin Pie
 - CMM27 – Kiwi
 - CMM8 – Basil
 - CMM31 – Licorice

OPTIONAL SUPPLIES

- Sunflower pattern (See last page)
- Tissue paper
- Dark colored water-based marker

Color Me Mine

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Optional: Lay the tissue paper over the sunflower pattern and trace the outline with a pencil.
2. Optional: Transfer the tissue paper over to the plate. Trace over the pencil lines with a dark colored water-based marker. Set the tissue paper aside and skip to Step 5.
3. Lightly pencil MOM on the plate or mug.
4. Lightly pencil some circles of different sizes around the plate to plan where to paint your sunflowers. Make sure to leave a good amount of space in-between these for the petals.
5. Mix and match Banana Boat and Pumpkin Pie between your different sunflowers. Paint one coat of the color for the petals. Try to do each petal in one stroke. Start from the tip of the petal and swipe your brush towards the middle of the flowers. Use the #4 round brush for the smaller flowers and the #6 round brush for the larger flowers.
6. Paint 1 watery coat of Kiwi in a donut shape on the pencil line along the edges of the petals.
7. Paint 1 coat of Cinnamon Stick in the very middle of the flower, inside the Kiwi lines.
8. Using the back of the pencil like a stamp, make Kiwi dots along the edge where the brown meets the green. For the smaller sunflowers, use the back of the brush like a stamp to make the Kiwi dots.
9. With the liner brush, paint 2 coats of Basil to create some leaves in the empty spaces.
10. Using the back of the pencil like a stamp, make Licorice dots to accent the sunflowers and fill space.
11. With the liner brush, paint "MOM" with 1 thick coat of Licorice.
12. Sign and date the back of the plate or bottom of the mug.
13. Leave your plate with your local Color Me Mine studio to be glazed and fired. Your masterpiece will be water and food safe.
